



Rules for the Pentathlon of the Arts and Sciences

1. NO KITS!

- Entry by proxy is allowed. Please note the entry as such on your registration form.
- Items must be virgin, having never been entered in any competition before except that previously used patterns, recipes, etc. may be entered as long as the actual entry is new.
- 4. No more than 2 items per person per sub-category.
- In order for a prize to be awarded in a sub-category, it must have at least 3 entries. Pentathlon autocrats reserve the right to combine or divide categories as they see fit.
- There will be a 25¢ entry fee for each item entered up to 8 items, payable at the time of registration. Over 8 items, there is a flat fee of \$2.00.
- Historical documentation should be thorough. Entrants will not be allowed to speak to the judges except at the judges' request. If you have something you want them to know, include it in your documentation.
- 8. We will be using 3" by 5" cards this year. They should have category name, entry name, and a brief description with bibliography. We suggest that you provide more thorough documentation (photocopies from sources, etc.) as well. Your documentation may take whatever form you wish, but do not put your name on it, or on the 3" by 5" cards. Cards will be available at the site.
- 9. To be eligible for the over-all Pentathlon Prize, at least 5 of the major (numbered) categories must be entered. Each person's highest score from within major categories will be taken. These scores (or the top 5 if more than 5 major categories are entered) will be averaged together. The person having the highest total will be the overall winner of the Ice Dragon Pent.
- Pentathlon registration begins at 9:30 am and closes at 11:00 am. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- 11. In order to reduce waiting on the part of the judges and entraits alike, there will be a judging schedule and we will be sticking to it. Have your entry available in the Pent Room on time or it will not be judged. We will not track you down.
- All "accessories" must be placed on tables for judging we will not judge items being worn.

- 13. Performing arts must be performed. Solo performance under 10 minutes; Group performance - under 20 minutes. See also Rule 11.
- 14. Items may be cross entered in more than 1 category, where appropriate. Please note so on your registration form, and fill out an index card for each category it is entered in. Indicate on the extra cards where the item has been placed so the judges can find it. and put those cards on the appropriate tables. If the judges cannot find your entry, it will not be judged.
- 15. Group entries should be noted as such on the registration form. Anyone who is in a group entry and is entered in the overall Pent must register for that category separately from the group, indicating that they are part of a group (and which group) if they want to receive these points toward their overall score.
- 16. In order to allow for more thorough and intelligent judging, copies of all entries in the "written words and music" categories must be received by the Pent autocrats on or before February 21, 1988. They will be on display the day of the event and will be returned to the writers then. We will not accept entries for these categories on the day of the event.

Mady Wins Coronet List

Meanwhile, over in the Principality of Drachenwald, people were doing just that. Their Majesties and Their Serene Highnesses conducted a coronet tourney at about the same time (give or take six or eight time zones) that we were having our Principality meeting. Seventy people attended the tourney which was held at Castle Frankenstein (yes, that Frankenstein) near Munich in the Barony of Knight's Crossing. There were gentles there from groups in Great Britain, Sweden, and Spain, as well as Germany.

The weather was great for fighting – in the mid-40°'s and overcast with a light wind. At 10 o'clock the tourney commenced with addresses to the participants by TRM and TSH. Eleven combattants, nine lords and two ladies, took the field and fought well and honorably for over two hours in a standard double elimination. His Majesty Morguhn and Duke Sir Merowald of the Middle and Trimaris marshalled throughout the day.

When it came to the finals Lady Gwenillian (*your æditor has without a doubt spelled it incorrectly) came up the winners side and defeated Vicount Sir Raim in two bouts straight, using sword and shield for both. Her inspiration was Lord Stephen (see * above) and they were invested as Tanista by Right of Arms and Tanist upon the field. Later in the day they were made Princess by Right of Arms and Prince of Drachenwald by Morguhn and Rowan.

Lady Gwenillian received her Tygers' Combatant just a few weeks earlier. I am told she hails from the Barony of Mountain Freehold in the mundane state of Vermont. This marks the first time a lady has ever won a standard coronet or crown tournament. (Vicountess Sir Maythen of Elfhaven won a competition called the five-fold list in the Principality of the Mists many years ago.) Let us raise a toast to a this valiant lady and her victory!



A Letter of Comment on Principality



As seems to be the custom, I offer an introduction, and some thoughts on the issue of a Principality where the Western Region now lounges. I am Svidrir, son of Einarr and Baron in their Oriental Majesties' court. Although I have been in the Middle Kingdom for two and a half years, I lived almost nine years in the Rhydderich Hael and may have one or two awards, but nothing to put me in the "big fish" class. In general, I am very happy that the Region may become a Principality and has this opportunity for fun and creativity. Here follow my comments.

To those who worry that the Region is the wrong shape/size, I almost agree. You can trim the most distant groups and not significantly reduce the size of the Principality. Or they may vote against the Principality anyway and make the point moot. Either way, you will have four new events, the majority of which will not be held at the far reaches. And I do not understand the logic of an argument which says you can be part of a Kingdom much larger than the Western Region, and have to travel to the east coast for many Kingdom events, but it is too much trouble to travel to BMDL or Coppertree once in a while to visit neighbors.

Will you be inundated with laws and bureaucrats? Come on. Principality officers will have to answer to Kingdom-level superiors, as Regionals do. Jurisdictions and territories will be about the same, or less if one or two groups do not join. What will Principality laws be if not echoes of Kingdom laws, which would be harmless, plus traditions and customs of the region and its various groups, as decided by representatives at Curia, which would be creative. As in SCA... Small fish will be at home, and only those who let themselves get into such a fine mesh (sorry) will have to sit or sleep through anything as inherently evil as representative government.

Oppressive taxes will not be levied; no orders will be given for the burning of temples or the destruction of villages. There will be no Czar, only pretend Princesses and Princes with no armies to back up bad decisions.

The Principality can be so much more than four Royalty per year plus awards and laws. It can be an opportunity for innovation! An Order of the Mini-Maunche given at a boring court following The Same Old Coronet Lists is not very innovative, but if someone is honored for authenticity, or research, or humor, and your royalty are chosen by melee combat, or fencing, or a pentathlon of sorts, suddenly the Society has much more variety. And less sexism.

Shires will get to host Principality events, at which Kingdom royalty may show up. Local folk without Patents of Arms will have opportunities to herald Principality courts and lists, present subtleties to Their Serene Highnesses, join the Principality Guard, or dedicate poetry to a Highness. When was the last time someone wrote a sonnet for a regional officer? When an original dance is presented after the first Investiture, how many will say "We could be at some other event?"

I hope you go with Inland Shores, a gryphon segreant, a parliament with some real powers, and a completely groundless claim that the Outlands is subject to your royalty. Dare to have fun.◆

A Brief History of the Rhydderich Hael



Not quite so long ago as Thescorre, yet still lost in the mists of Society antiquity, a tall blonde lady wandered into the Shire of Ashantal. Upon seeing the warriors there engaged in battle, she knew that she, too, had found what had been missing in her life, and resolved to bring it back to her home along the great Lake Erie. Thus did Morgan Elandris found the Shire of the Rhydderich Hael at the State University of New York at Fredonia back in a.s. XI (1976). Master Frederick of Holland (now a duke in the West) was living in Buffalo at the time and was of great assistance to Morgan in this effort.

Over its first few years, the Hael struggled to build its membership-Fredonia is a small college town 60 miles south of Buffalo, NY, and not a great breeding ground for something as unusual (read "weird") as the SCA. The city of Buffalo originally belonged to the Shire of Eastmere, but that group was dissolved in a.s. XII (1977). With no group in the city, the Hael began to attract Buffalonians, and as the Fredonia students graduated, many migrated to Buffalo. In this fashion, the central focus of the Hael eventually shifted to Buffalo. The founding of the Canton of Beau Fleuve by Count Frederick (aka "Uncle Flieg") sped the process along.

In a.s. XIII (1979), just three months after Thescorre attained Baronial status, the Hael did also, choosing Morgan Elandris as its founding Baroness. Mostly due to Baroness Morgan and House Elandris, especially the "Carthaginians," Hasdrubal, Mago and Hannibal (who later changed his name to James O'Neil), the Hael acquired quite a reputation in the martial arena. Unfairly, it also acquired an aura of heavy dourness. It's too bad that those who thought Morgan Elandris intimidating never saw her martyrdom to sainthood, where she was stoned to death with Milky Way bars! Nor did they see the "serious" O'Neil and Mago "jousting" with spears from their vehicles, or Hasdrubal "rowing" his car home from Pennsic.... Anyway, along with the reputation, the Hael acquired a lot of fighting peers; seven lords who have lived here are now Knights, two have sat upon the throne of the East, and the Tygers Combatants are too numerous to list.

As all things do, the Hael's involvement in combat waned back to more normal levels, especially with the departure of Morgan Elandris for Atlantia after her marriage in a.s. XVIII (1983). Wulfgar of Northumbria and Etta von Felsenstrand were chosen Baron and Baroness in her place, and the Arts began to flourish. In short order the Hael had a

calligraphers' and a cooks' guild, while music and dance practices increased in popularity. Fencing became a popular pastime, and the Hael now has a Baronial Duellist in addition to its rattan Champion, Baronial Bard, and Baronial Archer. Our biggest event, the Ice Dragon Festival, grew to amazing (and alarming) proportions, with 600 gentles attending its eleventh incarnation.

Wulfgar and Etta had their first son shortly after Pennsic XIV in a.s XX (1985), and so resigned their posts as Baron and Baroness at Ic Dragon X. For nearly two years, Master James O'Neil served most aby as our Vicar. Through two wearying rounds of Baronial elections he led us, but at last his retirement is nigh. At the Masked Ball on December 19, a.s. XXII (1987), the Rhydderich Hael elected Bedawyr favaricum as its new Baron. When he is invested at Ice Dragon XII, a new round of Hael history will begin. We hope you will all be there to share it with us!
