





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# From the Seneschal


Hello Again,

## Letters of Intent for Coronet Tourney

One last reminder to those planning to enter Aethelmark's Principality Coronet Tournament on September 23 in Thescorre, whether as combatant or consort:

Letters of Intent are due by September 9!

To correct the notice from the August AEstel, letters should be sent to BOTH Mistress Cassedoria, the Lady Protector, AND to Their Majesties Morguhn and Maurya (see inside front cover for addresses). Anyone who sent a letter to Cassedoria should send a copy to TRM. Make sure you include your SCA and mundane names, address, phone number, prospective consort, and proof of SCA membership.

Also, we request that combatants send a blazon, emblazon, or description of their registered Heraldic devices so that we may make best use of the heraldic display system at Coronet Tourney.

# From the Chamberlain

Unto the Good Gentles of the Principality of Aethelmark,  
Greetings from Lord Richard Tyler of Swiftwater, Principality Chamberlain!

Good Gentles,

As Chamberlain of the Principality of Aethelmark, I am responsible for both the histories and regalia for the Principality. A letter appeared in the August AEstel regarding the need for various pieces of regalia. This is an update to that.

On 2 December, the Heir and Heiress chosen at Coronet Tourney will be invested as our first Prince and Princess. On that day a pair of coronets will be required. To this end, the Regalia Committee (consisting of the Principality Herald, Exchequer, A & S Officers, and Chamberlain) is requesting designs for coronets for the Prince and Princess, along with cost bids. Bids must be made in writing to me by 10 am at Coronet Tourney. Hand delivered bids will be accepted that day. Each bid must meet the following criteria:

1. Two coronets are required. One for the Prince (26 inch circumference) and one for the Princess (24 inch). They should be similar in design. The sizes specified are those of the Cariadoc Crowns of the East.
2. Elegant simplicity will be favored.
3. The coronets must not be more elaborate than those for the Prince and Princess of the East. Use the Tyger Coronets as a guide here.
4. The coronets must be sturdy: expect them to be drop-kicked around the tourney field. We want to avoid constant maintenance if possible.
5. Consider using gold- or silver-toned metals. Escarbuncles could be part of the design. Red stones or enamelling would also be appropriate.
6. Total cost for the pair must not exceed eight hundred dollars (\$800). Cost should be reasonable based on materials used.

Various heraldic crest crowns (such as the Ancient, Eastern, Saxon, and Vallery, pictured below) may be used for a basic design, or perhaps something completely different. Remember that coronets are not as tall as crowns!

In addition to bids for coronets, a Regalia fund is being established. Anyone wishing to donate monies specifically for Regalia may send them to the Principality Treasurer (address at inside front cover of this issue), indicating that the money is to be used for Regalia. Also, a donation box will be set up at the troll at Coronet Tournay for Regalia Donations.

# On the Naming of Princes

Forms of Address for Principality Royalty  
by Mistress Arianna of Wynthrope

In a few short weeks, the Principality of Aethelmark will have its first Heir and Heiress. We will be creating new traditions and our own royal panoply, but some of the things we do will already have long and respected SCA traditions. One of those latter traditions will be the way we address our new feudal Lords and Ladies.

As it has been many years since the East has had a mainland Principality, and most of us only interact with Drachenwalders at Pennsic, a number of gentles are unaware of the proper forms of address for Principality Royalty. I therefore give you the following list of traditional SCA and medieval forms:

PRINCE AND PRINCESS: Your Serene Highness, Your Highness, Your Grace, Your Excellency.

HEIR AND HEIRESS: Your Excellency, My Lord Tanist/Lady Tanista

VISCOUNT AND VISCOUNTESS: Your Excellency, My Lord Viscount/Lady Viscountess

In the SCA, Territorial Princes are traditionally distinguished from Crown Princes as being "Serene" vs. "Royal" Highnesses. I tend to remember this by thinking that the Crown Prince has expectations of being Royal (King); the Territorial Prince is serene in his station, and will advance no further (at least, not during his tenure as Prince!).

For scribes accustomed to using the Latin forms, as in "Morguhn, Rex Orientalis" or "Maurya Regina," the Latin forms for Prince and Princess are Princeps and Principessa, respectively. The Latin for Principality is Principatus. I leave it to the linguists to try Latinizing Aethelmark...

By next June, we will have our first Viscount and Viscountess, which titles territorial Princes and Princesses assume upon stepping down from the throne. Below is a list of some of the translated forms of this title, courtesy of Master Wilhelm von Schlusel (former Laurel King at Arms).

English:	Viscount	Viscountess
French:	Vicomte	Vicomtesse
Italian:	Visconte	Viscontessa



The "G" and "T" points are the "bar" and are not used in this game.

Each player has six pieces or "wenches" at the start of the game. O's pieces are set at A-F; X's at S-N. The "wenches" move in a counter-clockwise direction (A-Z) around the board, skipping the bar automatically. The chase continues around the board until the game ends. The objective is to capture all of the opponents "wenches;" a capture is gained by landing on the same point as the opposing "wench."

The only rolls which are used are doubles, 6 and 1. This means that if a player rolls a 6-3, he uses only the 6; likewise a 1-5 uses only the 1. Rolls of 6 and 1 move only one man; doubles of 1 through 5 move ONE OR TWO men and are rerolled; doubles of 6 may move ONE, TWO, THREE OR FOUR men and have no re-roll.

No piles of two or more pieces may be formed. Therefore, if a piece would have to share a space with one of its fellows, it moves to the next open space.

When one player is reduced to one "wench," the play changes. The piece becomes a hornaskella, or "corner rattler." This means that the piece moves to a corner point (A, F, H, M, N, S, U, Z) by one of the moves below and stays on corner points. It may only be captured by an opponent landing on a corner and may only capture the opponent's "wenches" on the corners. A "corner rattler" moves in the following way: on a 1, one corner (i.e., A-F); on a 6, two corners (A-H); on a double 1, two corners; on a double 6, four corners (A-N). All other doubles are re-roll. If a "corner roller" is "sandwiched" between two opponent pieces, it can't be captured until one opponent piece moves. Capturing a "corner rattler" is a fairly long process. It gets more difficult when both players are reduced to "corner rattlers."

AY Elta Stelpur has proved to be a fast-moving game. It is easy to play after two or three attempts. It is a "tavern game" that can add excitement to your next event.

# Aethelmark Adventures

Well, the only event in August was (you guessed it) Pennsic, but as usual it was equal to about a dozen events rolled into one. The fighting was good, the parties were fun, the lunar eclipse (with attendant End-of-the-World) was awe-inspiring, the rain wasn't too awful, and the East won (5-2), so it was a good War in all. On Wednesday night, August 16th, at Eastern Court, the following Aethelmark denizens were honored:

From that Court, our beloved Principality Seneschal, Lord Magnus de Choc an Iora was taken on vigil to consider his entrance into the Order of the Chivalry. On Friday afternoon, August 18th, after the Champions' Battles, he chose the belt, chain and spurs of a Knight.

Thursday morning was our Principality Party, and a good time it was. The Mad Dog rattan tourney and the Accumulation fencing tourney went well (see Ellisif's missive for the names of the winners), and the lemonade, cookies and musicians were appreciated by all (probably in that order, too).

On Saturday night, August 19th, at Great Court, our valiant Principality Earl Marshall, Lord Bear of the Axe, was called forth to vigil by the Chivalry. On Sunday morning, August 20th, before the Bridge Battle, he was dubbed Sir Bear to the cheers of the Principality and the Kingdom.

Also Knighted at Saturday Great Court was a past citizen of Aethelmark, Mordred Mjodvintner. His Knighting brings the total Chivalry from the lost Shire of Ashantal to three...

At Closing Court on Sunday afternoon, the War banners were exchanged by Their Majesties, Palymar and Katherine of the Middle, and Morguhn and Maurya of the East.
